A Message From Our Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Is this your first time at Mass in a while? I know for many it is, and it would be silly to pretend otherwise. As a priest in his early 30s, I can tell you that most of my friends do not go to Mass on Sundays either. They'll tell me that while they don't worship on Sundays, they try to be good people. They'll even baptize their children to instill good values and the like. They'll tell me Mass just isn't for them; it's good to fall back on in times of distress, but they're spiritual in their own way. Some will go further and say they don't go to Mass because of some Church teaching, scandals, or the like.

I hear it, and I get it. Growing up in the 90s I was also taught the reason we go to church is to learn to be a good person; and for a while, I believed it. However, looking at the Christ Child in our nativity scene, I know that isn't true - becoming a good person cannot be the central theme of the Christian faith.

I would ask you, "What changed on the first Christmas?" What could we say was the same before Christ was born? Before Christ was born were the Jewish people capable of being good people? Certainly. Did parents want to instill good values in their children through ritual, education, and example? Of course, they did. On those days when families encounter loss or turmoil, could they turn to God in prayer? One needs only to read the Old Testament to see the depth of worship that took place before that first Christmas.

In fact, one could loosely claim those broad facts about the many pagan religions of the day. Were there good families who worshipped pagan gods? We might disagree on certain moral beliefs, but surely there were many upstanding families. Did Roman, Babylonian, Persian, Aztec, and Egyptian families want to raise virtuous children? Of course, every good parent has tried to form their children into what they considered to be a good citizen for their time and culture.

So what changed between December 24th and December 25th, 2023 years ago? What came into the world that day that didn't exist the day, year, and centuries prior? Jesus Christ.

What changed that first Christmas day was the inner voice urging people to do the right thing, encouraging them to raise their kids, and telling them that things will be okay when times got tough; what St. John called the Word or the Logos, and who we call Jesus Christ, was born.

For some reason the great punctuation mark on human history wasn't primarily a new lesson in being kind or a guidebook to living life, but a human person.

On Christmas, the Baby Jesus came to remind us that God's greatest desire is to have a real relationship with each one of us. Through His life, death, and resurrection, Jesus founded the Church so that we might form that relationship with Him in this life, and sustain it forever in the next.

My Invitation This Christmas

Wherever you are in your faith journey, whether you come to Mass every Sunday or once a year, I want to invite you to encounter the person of Jesus Christ.

He reminds us that what makes us good people and good families, is not our actions, or ticking off the right moral boxes, but instead His love for us.

He also calls us to follow Him. I know it might be hard, but I would invite you to come to Mass again, to pray again, to read scripture again, and to come to confession again so that you might encounter the person of Jesus Christ. If you need help, ask Him in prayer for it.

If you have been away, know that He still loves you, but He also misses you and wants you to come home.

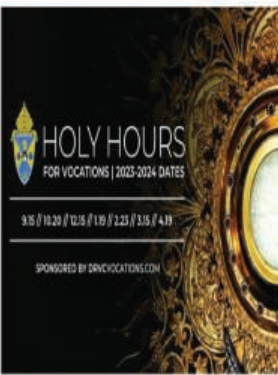
