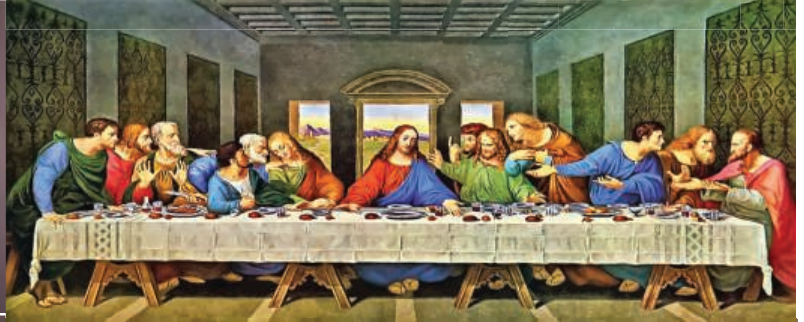

Ash Wednesday February 14th

“Father, Ash Wednesday is Valentine’s Day, can I get a dispensation so I can take my date out to a nice restaurant and not have to fast?”

The quick answer is - No, you may not.

How to get ready for Lent

Every year the question of “What should I give up for Lent?” comes up as does the answer “Instead of giving something up, I’m going to do something extra”.

The idea of doing something vs. giving something up often comes from the experience of a past Lenten fast not producing spiritual gains, and if we’re being honest it also comes from a culture that has fallen away from fasting and spiritual discipline generally speaking. My idea: do both.

In these days before Ash Wednesday, ask yourself “What is keeping me from being a saint”? Is it a mortal sin? Is it the lack of a virtue? Is it a family vice?

Habitual and Mortal Sin

If you find yourself falling into habitual mortal sin, and unable to stop (hopefully we are all trying to stop), discern what are the occasions of sin, actions, or vices that lead you to commit that sin? Try to stop the sin, yes, but also give up the action that leads to the sin. If watching the news leads to anger, give up the news for Lent, and replace the time with reading scripture. If using your phone late at night leads to impurity, envy, or sloth, buy an alarm clock, set a bedtime, and pick an intention for which you will offer the sacrifice of an early bedtime.

Lack of Virtue

If you think you would benefit from growing in a certain virtue, first ascertain which one to choose. My advice; find where you are most tempted, and choose the opposing virtue. It’s easy to do the things we like, but God doesn’t expect us to be successful. He wants us to be Holy.

If you struggle with anger in traffic, choose the opposing virtue of patience. Perhaps give up driving in the left-hand lane for Lent and commit to listening to a Catholic podcast in the car.

If you struggle with greed, give up online shopping or unnecessary spending and give away clothing to our St. Vincent De Paul Society - even give away one or two items you still like.

Family Vice

We can all do better as a family, but is there an area where your family struggles?

Are we making it to Mass every Sunday, or do we miss it because of games, appointments, or laziness? Does everyone go to Mass, except one person?

Have we become addicted to our smart devices as a family to the point where we cannot have a conversation?

Do we think holiness is something we can work on together as a family?

This Lent perhaps commit to going to Confession as a family or praying the Stations of the Cross. Take up a family penance - maybe you all give up social media. Let kids take turns inviting friends to come to Mass followed by breakfast.

Ash Wednesday will be here soon.

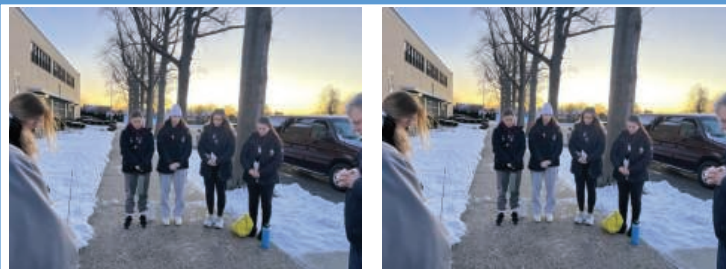

**MESSAGE FROM THE SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

Hello, my fellow parishioners, I’m presently the Treasurer of our St Vincent de Paul Conference for both the St. Ignatius Loyola and Holy Family parishes. I have published articles previously, and now would like to summarize some of our latest accomplishments.

As mentioned above, for those who have not as yet heard, our ministry now is responsible for supporting two parishes, St Ignatius and for the past several months, the Holy Family parish. This partnership has worked extremely well, and the needs of both parishes are addressed on a timely basis with respect and compassion. Our Fiscal Year ended on September 30th, and during the completed year our ministry completed **128** home visits. The definition of a home visit is two of our members (Vincentians) visit a neighbor in need and attempt to provide solutions to many problems, while always maintaining the confidentiality and dignity of those who are served. The problems are then discussed at bi-weekly meetings and solutions agreed upon at our conference meetings. During the Fiscal Year these home visits resulted in **33 rent payments**, the payment of **14 Utility Bills** and the purchase of over **\$9,000** in much needed furniture. Additionally, over \$2,000 in Gift Cards were distributed.

In addition to the above, food deliveries are made on a weekly basis, to 17-20 households, this includes canned products as well as vegetable and dairy selections. Other major activities included the delivery of 70 meals to 25 needy families on Thanksgiving morning as well as the delivery of Christmas toys to 32 families with 65 children. So, you see we were quite active!

As I mentioned in previous articles, financial support for our activities is a continuous challenge. Our September Friends of Poor fundraising is our major source of funding but in the past Fiscal year this covered only 22% of our Expenses. To mitigate this somewhat we are blessed by periodic financial donations from our loyal parishioners and by the proceeds from deposits made in the ‘Poor Boxes’ located in the churches. While we appreciate these donations, we continuously must reduce outlays and offer other creative solutions because of a shortage of funds.

During the past month of December, we received over \$1,300 in donations in the St Ignatius Poor Boxes. This was a major donation for us and shortly we will be receiving donations from the Holy Family parish. Poor Box donations can be a major source of funding!! As alternatives, contributions can be made by deposited envelopes in the Collection baskets marked for ‘St Vincent de Paul’ or mailed to the Rectories.

As St. Vincent de Paul taught us, “May our presence and care to those in need reflect the gentleness, esteem and dignity we see reflected in the life and work of JESUS. We want to thank you for your assistance in enabling us to follow his words and continue our mission. We know that the work of our ministry would not be possible without the support of people like you. Your contributions allow us to continue the work we do and make a meaningful impact on the lives of our neighbors.

Our ministry wishes you and your families a joyful New Year!!
